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Audio & Video Technology & Film Purpose:

Students will learn the fundamentals of video production including writing, shooting, directing and editing. All subject matter shall be taught as per specifications of **The Georgia Performance Standards** posted in the classroom. You may visit the Standards by visiting GeorgiaStandards.org

Prerequisite(s):

Students should have an open mind toward creating content and the communication of ideas. Students taking the upper level video production class will be required to successfully complete basic video production classes. A student failing any part of the class shall NOT be permitted to advance to upper level courses in video production.

Extra Materials by Student:

1. Students in LEVEL II or HIGHER will need a 16 GB or higher SD card CLASS 10 for recording purposes. It is also recommended that students have a 16 GB or higher flash drive for file transfer and quick mobility, and an external hard drive of at minimum 500 GB for keeping their work backed up.
2. Students will be expected to have their Chromebook in class and charged every day. Google classroom will be used every day.
3. Students may need loose leaf paper and pencil for some class assignments.

TSA and STN: It is highly recommended that all video students be members of the Technology Student Association and the Student Television Network. These are student club associations which support student technology and video production respectively. There are small dues associated with these clubs covered below.

Lab Fees: There is a recommended lab fee of \$30 which goes toward TSA and STN registration. The fee will also cover small studio cost such as cables, batteries, and storage media.

Requirements: Students will develop a YouTube channel as well as an online portfolio to be hosted on the channel. Students will be instructed on proper guidelines for social media and will post on social media pages. Specific social media outlets will change with prevailing industry standard.

All students will produce an informational/promotional videos for a school sponsored team or organization.

Work Ethic: points are earned each grading period. Points will be deducted for violations of the class rules, poor attendance, excessive tardiness, or behavior problems. Students may earn **extra credit** by volunteering to mentor, assist, shoot (video), or otherwise seek to promote the entire class professionally.

Events: All students must sign up for and work at least 5 events. Events will consist of working with Mr. Carroll or a student leader to produce video record or live video production of an event. If a student misses, is late or is not working during an event, the event will either not count towards their total or may count against their total. This will count as a test grade.

Late Work: Late work is any work that is not turned appropriately on the due date/time. Late work may be turned in for a reduced grade. Late work will be assessed a penalty of 11 points per school day until the reduction is at 50%. Late work that is turned in MUST adhere to the instructions and rubric and cannot be turned in until it meets ALL the requirements of instructions.

Tardy to Class: Students are expected to be in their seats and prepared for class instruction when the bell rings! Students not in their seats when the bell rings will be counted as tardy.
For each semester:

- 1st tardya written reprimand
- 2nd tardyone day private detention
- 3rd tardyone day public detention
- 4th tardyone day Saturday School
- 5th and subsequent tardyreferral to administrator

Cell Phone Policy: Students will surrender cell phone to instructor upon entry to class. Students may receive and use their cell phones under specific instructions from the teacher ONLY! If a cell phone is observed in any other capacity, including non-use, it shall be confiscated. HEADPHONES, EARBUDS AND ANY OTHER LISTENING DEVICE MUST BE REMOVED PRIOR TO ENTERING CLASS.

Class Rules and Studio Rules:

1. Students shall respect each other and self at all times.
2. All Safety All the Time!
3. Food and drinks are not permitted by students in the edit bay or in the studio. Water bottles should stay in your book bags, and should never be near the computers or any video equipment.
4. This is a professional studio; students shall act professionally at all times.
5. Students shall respect and care for all equipment and report any damage to equipment immediately.
6. All videos created must adhere to the guidelines of Northview High School Policies.
7. Any acts of vandalism or theft will result in immediate reporting and possible criminal charges.
8. All videos, images, words, graphics or other electronic media posted under the guise of NHS, The Bolt, or our social media pages shall always be NHS appropriate.

7. How to set up, shoot and tear down a field production including camera, tripod, lights, wireless microphones.
8. How to interview video subjects.
9. How to work as a team on a complex video production.
10. How to develop an effective portfolio.

Recovery Policy

1. Recovery is for students who, despite a conscientious effort and communication with their teachers, have failed to demonstrate satisfactory understanding of course standards. It is not for the student who has been failing for many weeks and then wishes to recover during the final days of the course. Opportunities for students to recover from a 74 or below *cumulative* average will be provided when all work required to date has been completed and the student has demonstrated a legitimate effort to meet all course requirements. *Students who have not attempted to complete all course requirements are not eligible for recovery.*
2. Students may initiate recovery on major assessments starting with the second major assessment of the semester as long as they have made a legitimate effort to meet all course requirements including attendance. Unexcused absences may prevent this opportunity.
3. So that students stay focused on the content at hand and don't become overwhelmed and fall too far behind, they must initiate recovery on a major assessment within five school days of being informed of the grade on that assessment. Recovery work must be completed within ten school days prior to the end of the semester. The nature and type of recovery assignment is given at the discretion of the teacher.

Grading guidelines for recovery assignments will vary by department. It is the responsibility of the student to fully understand the grading guidelines/highest possible score for completed recovery work.
