SYLLABUS FOR ADVANCED PRODUCTION

Northview High School

Course Objectives:

Students will learn about different forms of play production by writing and staging plays and presenting them to varying audiences. Each student will have opportunities to work on all aspects of the production.

Course Requirements and Expectations:

- 1. ALL written assignments must be typed. Technology-related excuses are not accepted.
- 2. Be respectful of each other. Intolerance is not tolerated.
- 3. Water is permitted in the classroom. All other food and drink are not permitted.
- 4. Listen carefully while other students (and the instructor) are speaking or performing in class.
- 5. Participation in all aspects of the production is required.
- 6. Wear clothing suitable for movement (or bring a change of clothes with you). Failure to do so will result in lowered grades for participation, as the student will not be able to participate.
- 7. Show up to class and show up on time... class is a rehearsal. Acting is a discipline!

Productions:

- 1. Roles will be selected by in-class audition.
- 2. Productions will be performed at Northview for other classes. We may also have evening performances (subject to student and space availability) similar to the fall showcase.
- 3. In order to participate in the four full-day performances, students must maintain above a 74 in all classes and must have a clean disciplinary record. If a student is not eligible to participate, the student's role will be given away. NO EXCEPTIONS.
